In an era where power is no longer concentrated in the hands of a single hegemon, the role of international institutions in fostering regional cooperation and integrating innovation becomes increasingly important. Emerging economies, such as Indonesia, Malaysia, the Philippines, and Vietnam, must be prepared to seize growth opportunities while building resilience to absorb external shocks. At the same time, developed countries should take a more active role in ensuring a more equitable distribution of growth, particularly through the transfer of knowledge, technology, and capacity-building initiatives.

As the largest student-led economic event in Indonesia, The 24th Economix aims to foster discourse on pressing global economic challenges across nations. This platform provides participants with the opportunity to critically examine key issues arising from the shift toward a multipolar world, including AI sovereignty, the green energy transition, and the evolution of the global financial system. Ultimately, it seeks to encourage the development of innovative solutions to address the world's pressing challenges.

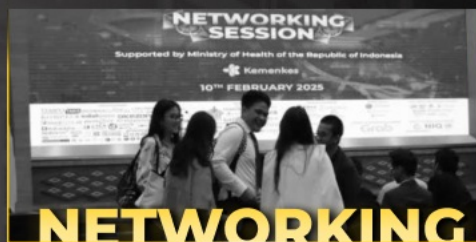

INTERNATIONAL DIALOGUE

In the past, the International Dialogue has been successful in educating international audiences regarding issues that have an effect on the global economy as a whole. The theme for The 24th Economix International Dialogue will be "Beyond the Barrel: Navigating Energy Transition as New Trade Opportunities". Heightened global uncertainty has transformed the use of critical minerals to an alternative source of energy and can be heeded as the "new oil".

Amidst the rising popularity of a new substitute for energy, many nations are rethinking their strategies and shift from fossil based fuel toward a more sustainable one. Developing countries are especially delighted to see these alterations, presenting them an opportunity to leap their economy even higher than before. This session will discuss how green transitions affect the supply chain, global value chain, and how countries should respond to this shift in general.

ECONOMIX COMPASSION ACT

The Economix believes in creating a positive impact towards society. To embrace and realise this impact, we created the Economix Compassion Act, a CSR Program highlighting our grand theme "Harnessing Innovation amid the Rise of Multipolarity".

OUR MAIN EVENTS: **INTERNATIONAL SEMINAR**

SESSION 1 Strengthening Regional Resilience through AI Sovereignty

This session explores how artificial intelligence is shaping economic competitiveness, security, and global influence, while highlighting vulnerabilities caused by its concentration in the United States and China. It emphasizes the importance of AI sovereignty in reducing dependence and strengthening national resilience. The discussion also examines how innovation, reskilling, and interconnected digital economies can help countries better withstand global disruptions.

SESSION 2 From Sustainability to Prosperity: Powering Economic Growth through Energy Transition

This session will examine how the shift to a more sustainable source of energy is the main key to foster a nation's economic strength. Unfortunately, current geopolitical tensions disrupt clean energy transition by the increasing use of coal, fueled inflation, and the strained emerging markets. Despite this, AI offers pathways for decarbonization and energy efficiency by advancing the "twin transition" - a sweet spot between digitalization and sustainability. The objective of the discussion is how a strong green industrial policy and coordinated global action are required to overcome instability and unlock sustainable economic growth.

SESSION 3 Strategic Autonomy in an Era of Shifting Global Financial Power

In this session, there will be a critical examination of how the global financial system for the time being is transforming toward a digital-first model where CBDCs redefine monetary autonomy, enabling emerging economies to bypass traditional clearing systems and boost cross-border efficiency. However, risks like debt instability and digital capital flight might hinder this very process. Therefore, the discussion will focus on how AI sovereignty plays an important role to ensure financial stability for all, as success in the modern era relies heavily on integrating innovation with strong sovereign technological capacity.

PAPER

The 24th Economix: Global Economix Challenges Paper Competition is an annual paper competition that aims to enable undergraduate students worldwide to share their ideas and knowledge about recurring issues, particularly the issues addressed in the 24th Economix, through a research paper.

The paper competition is divided into three rounds: Preliminary Round (Call for Paper Proposal), Semi-Final Round (Knowledge Assessment), and Grand Final Round (Conference). Firstly, delegates must submit a paper proposal no later than October 30th, 2026. Top 10 teams from the submitted paper proposals are expected to advance to the next stages of the Paper Competition. Afterwards, Meet-the-Experts training session will take place, where participants can have the opportunity to learn, evaluate, and receive feedback from experts on their paper writings before proceeding to the Semi-Final Round.

The Semi-Final will be held with the concept of; Knowledge Assessment (February 1st, 2027), where participants are going to be evaluated generally about the grand theme of the 24th Economix.

The Grand finals will be held with the concept of; Conference (February 3rd, 2027), where participants are going to present their revised papers to the respective adjudicators.



ESSAY

The 24th Economix Essay Competition challenges participants to organize their ideas and knowledge that revolves around the sub themes of the 24th Economix. We welcome participants to analyze the role of innovation amid the rise of multipolarity and its impact on global economic dynamics into the form of sharp and critical academic essays.

This competition is open to both undergraduate and high school students. Delegates are to submit individual work regarding one of the three The 24th Economix subthemes.



POLICY BRIEF

The 24th Economix: Global Economic Challenges Policy Brief Competition is a new innovation for delegates who have immense interest in formulating a policy for certain issues. Participants are challenged to organize their ideas and knowledge in the context of ongoing global economic problems into a sharp, solutive, and informative policy brief.

In the first stage of competition, participants are required to write a policy brief essay. After that, The Top 6 Finalists will be announced and are required to make a Campaign Content in a form of infographic which will be published in finalists' respective social media. Afterwards, the policy brief as a whole will be presented at the Grand Final Policy Brief Competition in which finalists are required to submit a day prior to the Grand Final Stage.

SUBTHEMES

AI Sovereignty for Strategic Regional Resilience

The AI revolution has reshaped digital sovereignty, exposing risks from reliance on foreign hyperscalers governed by laws like the US CLOUD Act and National Intelligence Law of China. This has driven the push for "AI sovereignty," where nations build independent infrastructure to secure critical training data. Germany's STACKIT exemplifies this as a regional model under General Data Protection Regulation with no US ties. Similar initiatives in France, Saudi Arabia, and the UAE highlight a shift toward localized control, though data localization risks fragmenting markets and slowing the spread of a technology projected to add \$15.7 trillion globally. Ultimately, AI sovereignty also raises broader economic and sustainability challenges, from resource consumption to workforce adaptation.



Green Energy Transition as a New Engine of Economic Growth

The global energy landscape is shifting as the green energy transition becomes both a driver of economic growth and a source of geopolitical tension. Renewable energy offers strong economic returns and is already boosting growth in countries like China. However, progress depends on global commitments such as the Paris Agreement, which are now weakening due to major countries stepping back. At the same time, rising geopolitical tensions, like trade protectionism and conflicts in key energy regions, are reinforcing short-term reliance on fossil fuels. As a result, the transition is not just environmental, but a balance between growth, energy security, and global power dynamics.



The Revolution of Global Financial System

The transition of the global financial system towards a post-dollar era is driven by U.S. fiscal concerns domestically and internationally, which causes many alternatives as a way to maintain monetary sovereignty. These alternatives, for example, Central Bank Digital Currencies (CBDCs), offer nations a path to enhanced monetary sovereignty. However, the move toward digital finance is hampered by a significant infrastructure gap, leaving developing economies vulnerable to debt and exclusion. While initiatives like El Salvador's Bitcoin experiment showcase the potential for systemic change, they also reveal the persistence of traditional preferences. Ultimately, the financial order is evolving into a state of "managed diversity," where technological innovation and geopolitical fragmentation redefine global governance.

COMPETITION: PAPER COMPETITION

TEAM ELIGIBILITY

1

Participants of The 24th Economix is a team that consists primarily of two to three members currently enrolled in Bachelor (S1), Program or Diploma (D4, D3) of any major. Team members could consist of active students from different universities.

2

Team members must not join more than one team.

3

Each team member must have a legitimate identification document (original student identity card and payment proof) required at pre-registration. If one of the members is unable to provide the proper and legitimate identification documents, the team will be disqualified from the competition.

4

Switching teammates after the registration deadline are not permitted.

5

Team members must not be replaced and/or absent throughout the Conference and Paper Competition.

6

If there is a circumstance that causes the inability of team members to follow a series of competitions, the team is obliged to notify the committee.

Teams that have won first place in previous years are not allowed to compete again in the same competition category, even with different members; however, they are allowed to participate in other competition categories.

The paper must be original and unpublished. Any form of plagiarism will not be tolerated.

INDIVIDUAL PARTICIPANTS REQUIREMENTS



Delegates of The 24th Economix are individuals that are currently enrolled in Bachelor (S1), Program or Diploma (D4, D3), or senior high school/equivalent.



Delegates coming from Indonesia must pay a registration fee depending on the level and the phase of registration: Rp55.000 (High School Level, Early Bird Phase); Rp70.000 (High School Level, Regular Phase); Rp60.000 (Undergraduate Level, Early Bird Phase); Rp75.000 (Undergraduate Level, Regular Phase). Delegates from other countries do not have to pay a registration fee.



Delegates must be registered as an active student at their university or high school.



Only entries by one single individual will be accepted for the essay submission

The 24th Economix Model United Nations provides delegates from differing backgrounds with the valuable opportunity to come together and challenge themselves to solve the defining issue of deglobalization and other international issues. This year's MUN will take place again at an on-site conference for a workshop session and six committee sessions.

Delegates will experience three days of rewarding diplomatic experience, filled with rich debates and negotiations by representing countries from around the globe in a United Nations council and to expose delegates on current world issues and how different nations approach the problem. Highly experienced conference directors will guide the discussions, accompanying delegates in crafting a joint draft resolution and ultimately select the highest performing delegates to receive awards.



MODEL UNITED NATIONS

MUN WORKSHOP



This year, on the 24th Economix, a Model United Nations Workshop will be held on the 1st of February, two days prior to the Economix Model United Nations conference day.

The Economix MUN Workshop is a full day of seminar about diplomacy, presentation of mastering MUN conference or Master MUN and a simulation of the committee session, or Committee Session 0, on the first day of the 24th Economix to educate and engage readers and/or delegates about MUN and the two councils as a part of the delegate package. The workshop will also invite a speaker for the opening speech, keynote session of diplomats and experts in relations to the council's topics to share knowledge upon the council's topic. As well as a presenter for the Master MUN session that gives materials needed to become an MUN delegate, as well as how to excel in an MUN conference.



COUNCIL TOPICS



UNEP - UNITED NATIONS ENVIRONMENT PROGRAMME

The United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP) is a leading global environmental authority within the United Nations established in 1972 to coordinate international environmental matters and aid countries in implementing sustainable development. Aimed towards addressing global environmental challenges, UNEP plays a role in tackling global issues such as climate change, biodiversity loss, and pollution by providing information and scientific research to facilitate international cooperation and the development of environmental agreements.

Topic : Reassessing the Paris Climate Agreement in Advancing the Green Energy Transition

Climate change impacts are intensifying, yet the Paris Agreement has had limited effectiveness in accelerating the global shift to green energy. According to the UNEP Emissions Gap Report 2023, global greenhouse gas emissions rose by 1.2%, reaching about 57.4 gigatons of CO₂-equivalent. Meanwhile, the International Energy Agency reports that renewable energy capacity surpassed 3,800 gigawatts by the end of 2023, but fossil fuels still account for roughly 80% of global primary energy consumption. This contrast highlights a gap between progress and climate goals, driven by challenges such as limited climate finance for developing nations, unequal access to green technologies, and ongoing geopolitical tensions affecting energy security.

The United Nations Disarmament and International Security Committee (DISEC) is the First Committee of the United Nations General Assembly, responsible for addressing issues related to international peace, security, and disarmament. The committee discusses global security challenges such as armed conflict, weapons control, cyber threats, and emerging risks caused by rapid technological advancement, including artificial intelligence (AI). As AI becomes increasingly integrated into digital infrastructure and cross-border data flows, concerns over data breaches, cyber espionage, and cyber conflict continue to grow. Through international dialogue and policy recommendations, DISEC works to promote global stability and strengthen international security cooperation.



DISEC - DISARMAMENT AND INTERNATIONAL SECURITY COMMITTEE

Topic: Addressing the Security Risks of Artificial Intelligence in Cross-Border Data Flows and Cyber Conflict

The rapid advancement of AI and the expansion of global data networks have introduced complex challenges to international security, particularly within the agenda of the DISEC. AI-driven cyber capabilities now enable faster, more scalable, and adaptive cyber attacks, increasing the risk of large-scale disruptions to critical infrastructure and institutions. At the same time, inconsistencies in cross-border data governance create vulnerabilities in global digital systems, facilitating cyber espionage and data exploitation. Efforts to enhance security through data localization policies may protect national interests but can also hinder global innovation and cooperation. Compounding these issues is the difficulty of attributing cyber attacks to specific actors, which weakens accountability and raises the risk of escalation in cyber conflicts, highlighting the urgent need for coordinated international frameworks and stronger cybersecurity norms.



COUNCIL TOPICS

The United Nations Economic and Financial Committee (ECOFIN) is the Second Committee of the United Nations General Assembly, responsible for addressing global economic governance and financial issues. The committee discusses a wide range of international economic matters, including macroeconomic policy coordination, sustainable development financing, taxation systems, poverty eradication, globalization, and the regulation of financial services. Through international dialogue and policy recommendations, ECOFIN works to promote a stable, inclusive, and sustainable global economic system.

Topic : Assessing the Impact of Digital Financial Transformation on the Global Monetary System

The global financial system is undergoing one of its most profound shifts in decades, driven by the rapid rise of digital financial technologies. Central Bank Digital Currencies (CBDCs), cryptocurrencies, stablecoins, tokenization, and Decentralized Finance (DeFi) are fundamentally changing how money is created, moved, and governed, bringing significant opportunities from modernizing payment infrastructure to expanding financial access for previously unbanked populations while also raising urgent questions around regulatory coherence, monetary sovereignty, and the long-term stability of the global financial architecture. At the same time, this transformation is unfolding against a backdrop of geopolitical realignment and growing economic vulnerability, as regional blocs such as BRICS and ASEAN develop alternative digital payment platforms to reduce reliance on the US Dollar, fueling debates around de-dollarization and the future of a multipolar currency system. Meanwhile, the absence of unified global regulatory standards risks fragmenting the international financial system, and rising sovereign debt particularly among developing economies leaves many nations with limited capacity to navigate these changes, challenging the international community to harness the potential of digital financial transformation while building a regulatory and cooperative framework that ensures stability, inclusivity, and equity for all nations.
