### IV. RESEARCH QUESTIONS

The research questions are the questions that a study or research is attempting to address. This question frequently refers to an issue or a problem that is addressed in the study's conclusion through analysis.



### V. METHODOLOGY

The references should follow the American Psychological Association (APA) format. The use of any other referencing format such as the Chicago format with footnotes is not allowed.

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


